QUESTION OF THE WEEK – February 1, 2026

If you had to pick one of these three requirements (justice, mercy, humility) to focus on this week, which one would it be and why?

Micah 6:1-8 - Dr. N'Guessan Affi

Hear now what Yahweh says:

"Come, plead your case before the mountains, and let the hills hear your voice! Listen to Yahweh's indictment, you mountains and you enduring foundations of the earth; for Yahweh has a dispute with the people, and is putting Israel on trial. O my people, what have I done to you? How have I wearied you? Give me an answer! For I brought you up from the land of Egypt, and redeemed you from the house of slavery; and I sent Moses to lead you, and Aaron, and Miriam! My people, call to mind the plans devised by the ruler Balak of Moab, and how Balaam ben-Beor answered him! Remember the journey from Shittim to Gilgal, and recall how Yahweh brought you justice!"

"What shall I bring when I come before YHWH, and bow down before God on high?" you ask. "Am I to come before God with burnt offerings? With year-old calves? Will Yahweh be placated by thousands of rams or ten thousand rivers of oil? Should I offer my firstborn for my wrongdoings-the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?"

Listen here, mortal: God has already made abundantly clear what "good" is, and what Yahweh needs from you: simply do justice, love kindness, and humbly walk with your God.
